
A patient suffering from concussion will show a sign of blackout for a short while in mild cases and coma in more serious cases.

An individual could suddenly become unconscious due to a heart attack. The initial signs are vomiting, profuse sweating and pain in the left side of the chest.

The rest died of hypothermia before the rescuers could pluck them from the cold sea. The final death toll amounted to 912 souls. However, there were an unpleasant number of questions about why the Estonia sank and why so many survivors were men in the prime life, while most of the dead were women, children and the elderly.


